INTEGRATED DEICING SERVICES GETS THE CALL FROM SALT LAKE CITY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Integrated Deicing Services (IDS, the company), Manchester, New Hampshire, announced today that they have been awarded a long-term agreement from The Salt Lake City Airline Deicing Services Committee for The Salt Lake City (Utah) International Airport (SLC). The Deicing Services Committee is composed of the following Airlines: Alaska, American, Frontier, jetBlue, Southwest and United.

IDS is the world's largest supplier of forced-air aircraft deicing technology. The company's innovative delivery of deicing solutions uses 30 to 50 percent less deicing fluid (glycol) for each aircraft "cleaned", at the same time increasing aircraft throughput times. This more environmentally-sound technique, and best-in-industry safety record appealed to the very ecologically and safety conscious committee.

"Our stated objective has always been to provide the safest, most cost effective and customer-focused deicing service in the industry. At the heart of our operating philosophy is a constant focus on our unique process management systems. The goal of which is one hundred percent safety and efficiency," said Dan Young, Director of Sales, Marketing and Customer Relations. Dan continued, "This agreement means a lot to IDS. We are very grateful that the committee agreed with our proposed solutions, and we have already started working with everyone involved at the airport to ensure we are fully operational by the start of the winter season."

"Needless to say, we were delighted when we received the call from SLC giving us the news that we earned this contract. IDS will now join our sister company, Quantem Aviation Services, at the airport where Quantem has been handling cargo for UPS since 2009. The contract is set to begin with this year's winter operations. The value of the agreement was not disclosed.
